Covid-19 Update: Whānau Ora Response





Whānau Direct - Whānau Direct provides an investment in essential resources of up to \$1,000. On average, 139 applications were processed per day with the most common items being kai (46%), firewood (7%), electricity arrears (5%), rent arrears (4%), heating appliances (3%) and laptops/computer essentials (3%).

Whānau Ora Packs - Almost 70,000 hygiene and sanitation packs have been distributed. Many of our partners continue to enhance packs with additional resources, such as non-perishable kai, and some are looking to add winter clothes and blankets in the future.

Kaiārahi - Kaiārahi continue to support whānau to ensure they have the essential resources they need. For many whānau, our kaiārahi have been the only support network they have had access to during the lockdown period. Whānau have acknowledged our Whānau Ora workforce as beacons of light and hope as we all respond to COVID-19.


